## Car

Renting a car is often the most practical and flexible way to explore LA, as attractions are spread out. Book in advance for the best rates—major rental companies operate at LAX and other airports, and many hotels can help arrange rentals.

## Metro

The Metro rail system runs daily from around 4:30 a.m. to 1:00 a.m., with extended hours until 2:30 a.m. on Fridays and Saturdays. Purchase a reusable TAP card to use on both trains and buses—day and weekly passes are available.

## Taxis & Rideshare

Taxis are available at airports, hotels, and major tourist areas, and can also be requested through apps like Curb. Rideshare services such as Uber and Lyft are widely available across Los Angeles and are often a faster and more flexible alternative.

## Bicycle

Metro Bike Share stations can be found in Downtown, Chinatown, and the Arts District. Pay with a credit card or TAP card after downloading the Bike Share app.

## Scooters

Electric scooters from companies like Bird, Lime, and Spin are available in many neighborhoods. Use the brand's app to locate, unlock, and pay. They're best for short distances, but always ride in bike lanes where available and follow local safety rules.



### Downtown (DTLA)

Skyscrapers, museums, theaters, LA Live, Crypto.com Arena, and vibrant food markets.

Famous for Korean BBQ, karaoke bars, nightlife, and cultural hotspots with authentic cuisine.

## Electricity

Standard power is **120V/60Hz**, with plugs featuring two flat parallel prongs. An adapter may be needed if you're visiting from abroad.



## Time Zone

Los Angeles follows Pacific Time — PST in winter and PDT during daylight saving months.



## Souvenirs

Popular keepsakes from Los Angeles include Hollywood-themed T-shirts, miniature Oscar statues, movie memorabilia, and Route 66 items. For collectors, there's no shortage of options — from mugs and shot glasses to snow globes and fridge magnets. For something special, browse local artisan markets or museum gift shops, and remember: don't buy from the first store you see on Hollywood Boulevard, as prices and quality can vary greatly.



## Currency & Payments

The official currency is the U.S. Dollar (USD). ATMs are common, and credit cards are accepted in most places, from restaurants to attractions.



## Tipping Guide

- Restaurants: 15–20% of the bill
- Bartenders: \$1–\$2 per drink
- Bellhops: \$1–\$3 per bag
- Housekeeping: \$2–\$3 per night
- Taxi/Rideshare drivers: 15–20%
- Shuttle drivers: \$1–\$2 per person
- Tour guides: 10–20% of tour cost



## Local Rules

- Alcohol: Minimum drinking age is 21 — ID is required for purchase.
- Walking: LA is spread out, and most people drive. If you walk, only cross streets at designated crosswalks; jaywalking can result in fines.
- Driving: Carpool lanes are for vehicles with two or more passengers. Rush hour traffic is heavy — weekdays 7–10 a.m. and 4–7 p.m. Avoid if possible.
- Nightlife: Bars and clubs typically close by 2 a.m.

- Check parking costs if driving.

## Check Travel Requirements

- Confirm if you need a visa, travel insurance, vaccines or specific documents.

## Pack Smart

- Include comfortable walking shoes, seasonal clothing, and essentials like a power adapter.
